

## **Pupil Premium – 2016/17**

As you may be aware, the Government give funding to schools for all children entitled to free school meals. For the academic year 2016/17, this amount worked out at approximately £264,700.

We ensure that the money is spent wisely and that all our children at Rack House Primary School benefit from the additional funding.

% of eligible pupils who are <b>either</b> FSM eligible in last 6 years or have been looked after continuously for 6 months achieving Year 6 Standard or above in both KS2 English and Maths	75%

As can be seen from this data, our FSM children are slightly behind their peers at the end of EYFS & Key stage 1, however the longer they attend Rack House, the better they attain. This can be seen from the fact that they achieve much better results at the end of KS2 than their peers.
